Application Eligibility

Prospective exchange students are first selected by their home institutions prior to the approval of their exchange study by the relevant academic departments of CityUHK.

Successful applicants will need to:

- meet the minimum academic requirements of CityUHK and be in good academic standing with their home institution
AND
- achieve a TOEFL score ≥ 79 (on the Internet-based test), IELTS overall band score ≥ 6.5 , Chinese Mainland's College English Test Band 6 (total score ≥ 450) or hold an [equivalent English qualification](#) if English is not the medium of instruction at their home institutions

Unless otherwise determined by the University for a specified course or programme, the medium of instruction and assessment at the University is English.

Minimum and Maximum Number of Modules to be taken in each semester

12 – 18 credit units per semester

Are students allowed to take cross-faculty modules?

Yes, subject to approval by the course-offering departments.

If yes, are there any restrictions?

At least half of the courses to be taken by the exchange students should be offered by the School of Energy and Environment.

Can students take modules of a different level?

Inbound exchange students can take undergraduate level courses. In case there is a strong interest in certain postgraduate courses, special approval from course leaders should be sought.

Any special language courses for exchange students prior to the exchange programme?

Accommodation

Residential accommodation for undergraduate inbound exchange students is available at Student Residence at Cornwall Street, subject to availability.

Health and Insurance

Are exchange students required to purchase a compulsory medical insurance plan?

Insurance is Mandatory

- Non-local students are required to have suitable and adequate insurance for the entire period of their study at City University of Hong Kong (CityUHK). The insurance should cover but not limited to travel, personal accidents, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalisation and emergency evacuation/repatriation. Students are advised to take out a travel and medical insurance policy before departing for Hong Kong.
- If you do not have your own insurance coverage before coming to Hong Kong, or if you wish to buy additional insurance, you may enrol in the CityUHK-contracted insurance plan. The CityUHK-contracted insurance plan is available to all non-local students, and it provides relatively basic coverage such as personal accident and medical benefits.
- CityUHK-contracted insurance plan does not include general medical consultation/outpatient coverage. Students holding a Hong Kong Identity Card are eligible to use public hospital services at the local rates. Besides, the Young Chung-Yee Health Centre provides general medical consultation services to students on a fee-paying basis.
- If you wish to secure all-round protection, you should purchase an insurance policy on the market that will meet your personal needs.
