Research Achievements

Department of Public and International Affairs (PIA) was established in 2022 after the merger of the Department of Public Policy and the Department of Asian and International Studies. With 40 faculty from 14 regions, the PIA covers most areas and approaches in public policy research. The PIA emphasizes the integration of empirical, theoretical research, and interdisciplinary research with a comparative study of Hong Kong, mainland China, Asia-Pacific region, and beyond through six inter-related research clusters:

Research Achievements

PIA has 9 associated research centers and laboratories:

Since October 2019, our faculty members have held 7 editorships and over 80 editorial memberships in leading journals and executive positions in professional associations. PIA produced more than 700 research outputs and captured over 35 million in external competitive peer-reviewed grants and nearly HK\$9 million in research contracts to facilitate individual and collaborative projects, enhancing research excellence.

Center for East Asian and Comparative Philosophy (CEACOP)

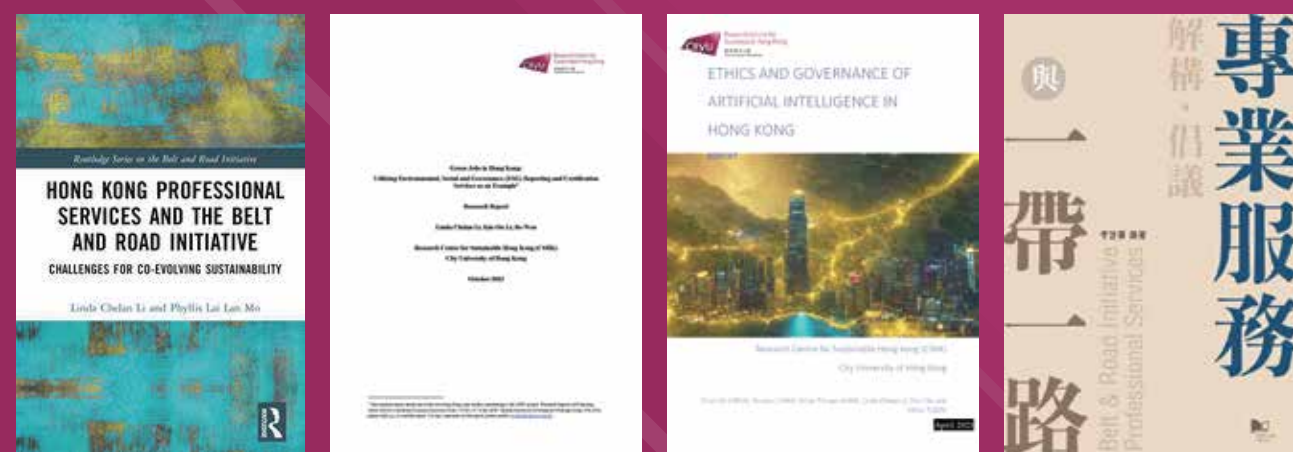
CEACOP

The primary aim of the Center for East Asian and Comparative Philosophy (CEACOP) is to promote and enhance the study of East Asian and Comparative Philosophy globally. Toward that end, the center brings together core faculty members within the Department of Public and International Affairs, who all have active research programs in East Asian and Comparative Ethics, Political Philosophy, Law, and History of Political Thought, with special attention to democracy, civic virtue, constitutionalism, rule of law, humane government, social and economic justice, and human rights. In addition, CEACOP invites scholars outside of the City University of Hong Kong (CityU), from Hong Kong, East Asia, and around the world, with similar interests to campus in order to share their research and exchange ideas. The center hosts or supports several major research projects and actively seeks additional projects and funding to continue to build and expand its ability to serve as a leading institution producing and supporting research in East Asian and Comparative Philosophy. Since its establishment in 2013, CEACOP has organized more than two dozen international conferences and workshops and hosted the CEACOP Annual Lecture six times by inviting leading philosophers and political theorists. Core members of CEACOP have published their books with leading university presses such as Cambridge University Press, Oxford University Press, Princeton University Press, and Stanford University Press and their academic articles have appeared in top journals such as American Political Science Review, Journal of Politics, British Journal of Political Science, American Journal of Bioethics, and Journal of Medical Ethics, among others.





Research Centre for Sustainable Hong Kong (CSHK)



CSHK

Established in June 2017 by a cross-disciplinary research team, the Research Centre for Sustainable Hong Kong (CSHK) is an Applied Strategic Development Centre of CityU. CSHK houses the SusHK Hub and supports all the research and collaborative activities with stakeholders from different sectors and regions.

CSHK conducts impactful applied research with the mission to facilitate and enhance collaborations among the academic, industrial and professional service sectors, the community and the government for sustainable development in Hong Kong and the region. CSHK has held over 15 seminars, forums, lectures & meetings with relevant stakeholders over the past 18 months.

CSHK members come from a variety of disciplines at CityU, including Political Science, Philosophy, International Relations, Behavioural Science, Sociology, Law, Media and Communication, Economics and Finance, Accounting, Management Science, Civil Engineering and Electronic Engineering. CSHK also collaborates with international and professional advisors and associates to enhance our ability in research and outreach. Professor Linda Chelan Li, Department of Public and International Affairs, is Centre Director. Professor Phyllis Mo, Department of Accountancy, is Associate Director.

Research areas include sustainable development of Hong Kong professional services in the context of the Belt and Road Initiative, the Greater Bay Area policy, green finance and sustainability transition, COVID-19 and governance, Artificial Intelligence, ethics and governance, and diversity-equity-inclusion issues. CSHK's recent major publications include the “Estimation of Financed Emissions in Hong Kong and Policy Recommendations” Report (Apr-2024), “AI Governance: Ethics and Policy Challenges in Hong Kong” Report (Apr-2023) and the “Hong Kong Professional Services and the Belt

Laboratory for Public Management & Policy (LaMP)



LaMP

Since 2013, the primary aim of the Laboratory for Public Management & Policy (LaMP) has been to use rigorous research to enhance the performance of public services. We are a group of faculty studying policy and organizational design, management practices, and interactions between citizens, interest groups, and public organizations. We particularly focus on experimental designs, systematic research synthesis, and careful analysis of observational data.

LaMP members hold a number of competitive research grants, which help us conduct cutting-edge research. Here are a few examples of grant-funded research that LaMP members are currently working on:

1. LaMP member Yanto CHANDRA (PI) is working on the Hong Kong General Research Fund (GRF) project, Understanding the Governance of Decentralized Autonomous Organizations as a Novel Organizational Form in the Blockchain Economy
2. LaMP members Bert GEORGE (PI) and Richard WALKER and LaMP alumnus Peiyi WU are working on the GRF project, The Effect of Red Tape on Emotions: A Comparative Replication Study.
3. LaMP member Nicole LIU (PI) is working on the GRF project, Regulatory Intermediaries under Institutional Complexity: Roles, Government Connection, and Market Performance.
4. LaMP member Nick OR (PI) is working on the GRF project, Gauging Perceived Political Sensitivity in Political Opinion Polls: A Multi-Measure Design.
5. LaMP member Nick PETROVSKY (PI) is working on the GRF project, An Experimental Test of the Satisfaction Mirror between Frontline Public Servants and Citizens.
6. LaMP member Xiaohu WANG (PI) is working on the GRF project, The Influence of System Context on Collaborative Actions.

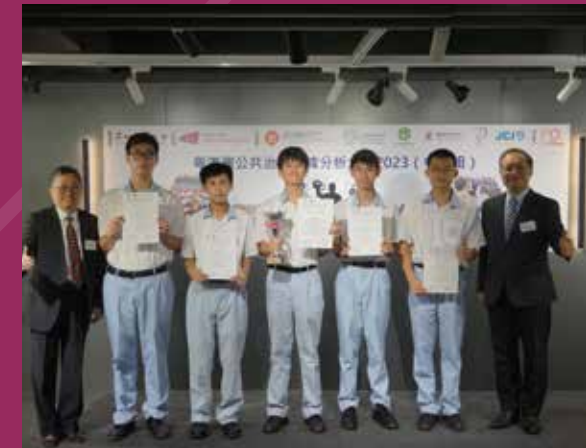

Lab for Impact Financing and Transformation (LIFT)

LIFT

The Lab for Impact Financing and Transformation (LIFT), founded in 2023, aims to study and advocate the diverse use of financing strategies, including taxation, regulatory fees, user charges, debt financing, philanthropic donation, corporate investment, and grants. Through exploring the innovativeness, accuracy, and cost-effectiveness of their fiscal and policy impacts, LIFT believes that the societies can leverage public and private capital and accomplish the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and desirable economic and social impacts effectively.



LIFT pursues research projects locally in Hong Kong and Asia. Prof. Alfred Ho and Prof. Ilex Lam, the co-directors of LIFT, are leading our affiliated members in organising various cutting-edge and interdisciplinary research projects to enhance public administration and sustainable development. We pioneer linking performance-oriented budget management to the SDGs and improving citizens' health and well-being through global collaborations. Additionally, we are collaborating with industrial leaders and professional associations to analyse the long-term development of the fashion and textile industries, as well as the well-being and empowerment of women in Hong Kong. We are also investigating the impacts of emerging technologies like Virtual and Augmented Realities and the Metaverse on public service, education, and finance government. We also focus on enhancing the long-term viability and financial sustainability of social enterprises, with a special emphasis on empowering individuals with disabilities for better employment opportunities in the tech sector. These projects lead to working papers, conferences, seminars, books, and journal articles.





Political Analysis Lab (PAL)

PAL

Established in 2017, the Political Analysis Lab (PAL) is dedicated to advancing political science research and improving evidence-based analysis both locally and globally. PAL adopts an integrative approach that combines empirical studies of pressing socio-political phenomena with cutting-edge research methodologies. Currently, PAL boasts a team of more than ten faculty members, one post-doctoral fellow, five doctoral students, and two research assistants. These individuals advance the study of comparative politics, digital governance, public opinion, public health, social resilience, and the interactions between citizens, business communities, and the public sector.

PAL provides faculty and students with opportunities to engage in scholarly activities using a diverse range of research approaches and methods. Our primary areas of emphasis include experiments, surveys, computational methods, and critical analysis of observational data. Many of our lab members have contributed to cross-national surveys on well-being and value changes, such as the World Values Survey, the Asian Barometer Survey, and the V-Dem Dataset. PAL supports research, teaching, and knowledge transfer on a range of governance issues. The lab consistently hosts talks and seminars featuring scholars from leading institutions worldwide.

The Budget Governance Lab



The Budget Governance Lab aims to produce high-quality fiscal policy research and government fiscal policy reports, and train research students in fiscal research. The lab has been engaged in collaborative governance research in the Greater Bay Area, environmental and sustainable financing research, and fiscal transparency research in collaboration with the International Budget Partnership IBP. The research products of the lab have appeared in major research and policy outlets such as Public Administration Review, Public Money and Management, and the China Review. The lab aspires to become the primary source of fiscal policy research in Hong Kong. The lab is directed by Professor Xiaohu Wang.



Policy Lab for Hong Kong Talent Development (TDPL)



TDPL

In 2024, the Department of Public and International Affairs launched the Policy Lab for Hong Kong Talent Development (TDPL), with backing from the Hong Kong Talent Center and the Hong Kong Association of Tertiary Education. Our mission is to conduct research to inform policymakers and stakeholders on effective strategies for developing, attracting and retaining top talents across different sectors, thereby bolstering the economic competitiveness in Hong Kong. Our research focuses on identifying the obstacles in talent development, attraction, and retention, and offers policy recommendations to assist the government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in these endeavours more effectively.

In January 2024, our Lab's Founding Members, Prof. Alfred Ho, The Hon. Matthew Cheung, Ms. Miranda Tsui, and Mr. Raymond Lam, held a conference to share our findings with industrial leaders and professional associations. Our future conferences and activities will focus on policy research related to talent development and retention strategies, including empowering women and enhancing their well-being. This focus aims to ensure female talents have equal opportunities to contribute to the long-term development of Hong Kong. Additionally, we plan to publish materials that engage key stakeholders from various sectors and promote cross-sectoral collaboration to foster talent development in Hong Kong.



Southeast Asia Research Centre (SEARC)



SEARC

Since its establishment in 2001, the Southeast Asia Research Centre (SEARC) at City University of Hong Kong has been a beacon of excellence in the study and understanding of contemporary Southeast Asia. SEARC's mission is to sustain and enhance its international reputation as the leading research center in China for the production and dissemination of knowledge about Southeast Asia. Through a multi-disciplinary approach, we strive to generate high-caliber scholarship, foster academic and applied research, and promote mutual understanding within the region and beyond.

In recent years, SEARC has organized a series of impactful events to engage both academic and wider communities. These include seminars featuring high-profile academics from around the world, providing platforms for in-depth discussions on key issues facing Southeast Asia. Additionally, SEARC has hosted talks with distinguished policy-makers, such as Mahathir Mohamad, former Prime Minister of Malaysia, facilitating dialogue between academia and policy circles.

SEARC has also actively collaborated with Southeast Asian communities in Hong Kong, for example by organizing training programs to empower domestic workers and roundtables to address relevant policy issues. These initiatives reflect our commitment to meaningful engagement and fostering positive change at the grassroots level.

Looking ahead, SEARC is gearing up to host the annual meeting of SEAREG, the international renowned organization for the study of Southeast Asia in social science. This prestigious event will bring together scholars and practitioners from across the globe to exchange ideas, share research findings, and strengthen collaborative networks.



Urban Research Lab (URL)



URL

The Urban Research Lab (URL) at CityU delves into the intricate dynamics of cities across the Global East. Situated in Hong Kong, a bustling metropolis emblematic of urban life, our lab is dedicated to exploring the rapidly evolving urban landscape, bridging the global divide between East and West.

Comprising an international, multidisciplinary team, URL spearheads a diverse array of externally funded projects spanning Mainland China, South Africa, Italy, Finland, Japan, Thailand, Vietnam, India, and our home city, Hong Kong. Our research ethos blends theoretical rigor with social relevance, aiming for intellectual stimulation alongside practical impact.

Our work encompasses three primary areas:

1. City, culture and society (platform urbanism, culture and place-making, co-working, urban mobilities and migration; neighbourhood dynamics and social change)
2. City and public policy (urban governance and policy; housing and affordability; housing inequality and social stratification, urban territorialization)
3. City in the Political Ecology (circular economy, low-carbon cities, climate change, health)

Academic Programmes

Bachelor of Social Sciences in Public Affairs and Management (BSSPAM)

The Bachelor of Social Sciences in Public Affairs and Management (formerly titled Public Policy and Politics) aims to provide students with a comprehensive education in the common core theories, concepts, and knowledge bases of public policy, public management, and political science. It enables students to specialize in public policy, public management, or political science for gaining an understanding of the essential theories, principles, dynamics, and analytic approaches of these bodies of knowledge. It also aims to equip students with the theoretical, conceptual, and analytical tools to understand comprehensively public policy, public management, and political developments in Hong Kong, China, and the contemporary global world. Graduates of the programme can meet effectively the human resources needs of a wide range of public and private sector employers in administrative, management, and policy and political analysis positions, as well as in the media and non-governmental organizations.

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Bachelor of Social Sciences in International Relations and Global Affairs (BSSIRGA)

The Bachelor of Social Sciences in International Relations and Global Affairs aims to develop students' knowledge of social, political, economic, environmental, and cultural processes of change occurring in the countries of Asia and to situate them in the broader international context, reflecting the increasing significance of Asia in world affairs.

Through training and practice in social research, the programme seeks to equip students with analytic skills of value to organizations in diverse economic sectors in Hong Kong, the region, and beyond. BSSIRGA will prepare its graduates for professional careers in business, non-profit, and governmental organizations, education and research organizations, and other organizations whose operations require social research skills and an informed international outlook.

Through its interdisciplinary curriculum the programme prepares students for careers in diverse fields by enhancing students' skills in critical reasoning and extending and deepening their international, regional, and global perspectives. It equips them to think independently, and to innovate in approaching problems and devising solutions in intellectual and professional contexts.



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Master of Arts in Public Policy and Management (MAPPM)

The Master of Arts in Public Policy and Management aims to broadly support the development of effective, people-centred governance in Hong Kong and around the world by producing graduates who can creatively contribute to policy analysis for, and the innovative management of, a wide range of issues of public concern. In particular, the programme will provide students with opportunities to: enhance their theoretical knowledge and to discover new insights into public policy making and management in both local and international contexts; develop their intellectual capacity in researching systematically and analysing critically theories and information about the effective and efficient utilization of public resources for the betterment of society; and develop practical skills required for effective public management and to strengthen their abilities to contribute to creative and innovative problem solving in public policy and management contexts.



Master of Social Sciences in Sustainability and Development Studies (MSSSDS)

The Master of Social Sciences in Sustainability and Development Studies (programme revamped from the former Master of Social Sciences in Development Studies) aims to

1. prepare students for a broad range of careers in development, sustainability, and public policy including the rapid emergence of industry and research jobs that require integrated knowledge about all three;
2. equip students with the broad-based knowledge and specific skills to integrate aspects of development, sustainability, and public policy into their existing career trajectories;
3. cultivate students as citizen-thinkers with a thorough understanding about pressing global and local issues in development and sustainability that impact not only their careers but also society more broadly.



Master of Arts in Housing and Urban Management (MAHUM)

The Master of Arts in Housing and Urban Management trains professional housing and urban managers for both the public and private sectors in Hong Kong and the Region. The programme equips graduates with thorough understanding of the social, political, economic, legal and physical institutions within the context of housing and urban management; and furnish graduates with high level analytic and management skills for the personal enhancement of the graduate in their future career as well as further development of the profession.



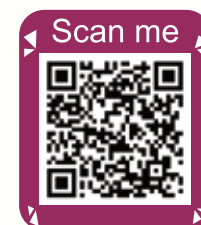
Master of Arts in International Studies (MAIS)

The Master of Arts in International Studies aims to provide students with a deeper understanding of regional and international affairs. This knowledge will not only help graduates to upgrade their professional abilities, but will also ensure that they are equipped with the necessary tools to understand the global and regional forces that shape our world. The programme will provide advanced training for students seeking to strengthen their analytical skills, develop the capacity to conduct original research, and bolster their communication and presentation abilities.



Research Degree Programme

The PhD programme aims to provide advanced training for PhD students in the area of politics, policy and administration. It aims to help students pursue academic achievements in social research and develop independent and critical thinking capability, mastery of qualitative and quantitative methodologies, and writing skills necessary for the successful publication of research findings. It will offer students opportunities to acquire scholarly competence in conducting research on public management, policy studies, political studies, comparative politics, and philosophy and theory.
