- Explain, compare and evaluate critically various values, ethical principles and cultural traditions shaping policy-making processes and the delivery of services to the community

The Programme will provide students with opportunities to:

- Enhance their theoretical knowledge and to discover new insights into public policy making and management in both local and international contexts
- Develop their intellectual capacity and analytical skills by doing applied research on the effective and efficient utilization of public resources for the betterment of society
- Hone practical skills required for effective public management and to strengthen their abilities to contribute to creative and innovative problem solving in public policy and management contexts
