Stephen Hui Outstanding Student Athletes Scholarships

Regulations

Purpose

To award student athletes who have outstanding sports achievements/performances and contribution, here are the suggested regulations of the Scholarship:-

Value and Number of Award

- There shall be a maximum of 10 scholarships to be offered in 2015-16 academic year. The value of each scholarship shall be HK\$10,000 per recipient.

Eligibility

- Eligible applicants for the scholarships shall be full-time students who are successfully admitted to the University in 2015/16 and will join the University's sports teams and participate in training and races.
- The scholarships shall be disbursed to the recipients by two equal installments by crediting to students' personal bank account. The first instalment is payable in middle of Semester A while the second is payable in the end of Semester B subject to the condition of the students who can achieve:
 - a. a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at 2.0 or above by the end of Semester A of the year; and
 - b. satisfactory sports performance as determined by the Physical Education Section of Student Development Services.
- The Physical Education Section may reserve the right to withhold the payment for Semester B if student does not make satisfactory sports performance and team contribution in Semester A of the academic year.
- The sports achievement / performance of the candidates will be recognized in the recent two years (i.e. 1 Sep 14 – 30 Aug 16).

Nomination Procedure and Deadline

- Nomination(s) shall be made by the coaches of CityU Sports Teams, and winners of the awards shall be selected by a Selection Panel chaired by the Associate Director (Physical Education) of Student Development Services by October of each year.

Remarks

Total sum of the Scholarship is HK\$100,000. Distribution of the Scholarship is expected to complete in the academic year of 2015/16. In case the scholarship cannot be fully distributed by end of 2015/16, the remaining sum will be carried forward for allocation in 2016/17.
