# Part II Course Details

#### **Abstract**

This course introduces students with no previous knowledge of the language to basic structures and vocabulary of Korean through reading, writing, listening and speaking. The course enables students to read and write Korean alphabet (Hangeul), become familiar with basic sentence structure and basic vocabulary so as to perform simple communicative tasks in everyday life. By the end of the course, students should have reached a proficiency level roughly equivalent to the Test of Proficiency in Korean (TOPIK) Grade 1.

The student demonstrates excellent speaking skills to produce clear and fluent speech for at beginner level, and to use appropriate expressions for the context without any errors (e.g., grammar, pronunciation and/or contextual appropriacy).

# Good (B+, B, B-)

The student demonstrates good speaking skills to produce clear and fluent speech at beginner level, and to use appropriate expressions for the context with a few errors (e.g., grammar, pronunciation and/or contextual appropriacy).

#### Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student demonstrates fair speaking skills to produce somewhat comprehensible speech at beginner level, and to use appropriate expressions for the context with frequent errors (e.g., grammar, pronunciation and/or contextual appropriacy).
