Part II Course Details

Abstract

This is a pre-intermediate level course which aims to train students to communicate in Japanese in areas concerning personal, social, cultural issues and current affairs. After completion of the course, students should be able to use Japanese to express themselves in daily life conversation. They should also be capable of differentiating different levels of politeness of Japanese. By the end of the course, students should have reached a proficiency level roughly equivalent to the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N5 (Part 3)/Level N4 (Part 1).

1a. Test 1 (Mid-term – Language Knowledge – 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Demonstrating control of basic elements of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at pre-intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N5 (Part 3)/Level N4 (Part 1).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

1b. Test 1 (Mid-term – Writing Test – 20% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Producing a 300-word Japanese written text, showing control of different levels of politeness using grammar and vocabulary at pre-intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N5 (Part 3)/Level N4 (Part 1).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student produces a 300-word Japanese text with few mistakes; mistakes never impede comprehension.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student produces a 300-word Japanese text with some mistakes; mistakes may occasionally impede comprehension.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student produces a 300-word Japanese text with somewhat frequent mistakes; mistakes occasionally impede comprehension.

Marginal (D)

The student produces a 300-word Japanese text with frequent mistakes; mistakes often impede comprehension.

Failure (F)

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student produces a 400-word Japanese text with few mistakes; mistakes never impede comprehension.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student produces a 400-word Japanese text with some mistakes; mistakes may occasionally impede comprehension.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student produces a 400-word Japanese text with somewhat frequent mistakes; mistakes occasionally impede comprehension.

Marginal (D)

The student produces a 400-word Japanese text with frequent grammatical mistakes; mistakes often impede comprehension.

Failure (F)

The student is unable to produces a 400-word Japanese text; the text produced contains very frequent mistakes; mistakes very frequently impede comprehension; student shows little knowledge of Japanese.

2c. Test 2 (Listening Test - 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Understanding different types of sentence and extracting specific meaning in recorded Japanese conversations at preintermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N5 (Part 3)/Level N4 (Part 1).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student demonstrates strong listening comprehension skills at pre-intermediate level for dialogues involving familiar situations.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student demonstrates generally strong listening comprehension skills at pre-intermediate level for dialogues involving familiar situations.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student demonstrates reasonable listening comprehension skills at pre-intermediate level for dialogues involving familiar situations.
