Part II Course Details

Abstract

This is an intermediate course which aims to develop students' oral communication skills and aural comprehension competence at higher level for social, commercial and professional purposes. After completion of the course, students should have acquired a comprehensive knowledge of expressions and be able to communicate in Japanese properly and fluently. By the end of the course, students should have reached a proficiency level roughly equivalent to the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N4 (Part 2).

Assessment Task

1a. Test 1 (Mid-term – Language Knowledge – 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Demonstrating control of elements of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student demonstrates strong understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at intermediate level with almost no mistakes.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student demonstrates generally strong and mostly consistent understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with few mistakes.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student demonstrates reasonable understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with somewhat frequent mistakes with somewhat frequent mistakes.

Marginal (D)

The student demonstrates limited understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with frequent mistakes.

Failure (F)

The student demonstrates inadequate understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with very frequent mistakes.

Assessment Task

1b. Test 1 (Mid-term - Writing Test - 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Fulfilling writing task with rich and relevant content using grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student expresses reasons and explanations for opinions in a written text with almost no grammatical mistakes; mistakes never impede comprehension.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student expresses reasons and explanations for opinions in a written text with few grammatical mistakes; mistakes may occasionally impede comprehension.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student expresses reasons and explanations for opinions in a written text with somewhat frequent grammatical mistakes; mistakes occasionally impede comprehension.

Marginal (D)

The student expresses reasons and explanations for opinions in a written text with frequent grammatical mistakes; mistakes often impede comprehension.

Failure (F)

The student displays very little knowledge of Japanese, and is unable to express clear reasons and explanations for opinions in a written text; mistakes very frequently impede comprehension.

Assessment Task

1c. Test 1 (Mid-term – Oral Test – 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Fulfilling the task, producing grammatically correct spoken sentences and displaying control of intonation and accent at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student produces rehearsed speech very fluently at intermediate level, using appropriate expressions with almost no mistakes.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student produces rehearsed speech mostly fluently at intermediate level, using appropriate expressions with few mistakes; mistakes may occasionally impede comprehension.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student produces rehearsed speech comprehensibly at intermediate level, using mostly appropriate expressions with somewhat frequent mistakes; mistakes occasionally impede comprehension.

Marginal (D)

The student produces rehearsed speech somewhat comprehensibly at intermediate level, occasionally using appropriate expressions with frequent mistakes; mistakes often impede comprehension.

Failure (F)

The student produces rehearsed speech which is incomprehensible, with very frequent mistakes.

Assessment Task

2a. Test 2 (Language Knowledge – 20% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Demonstrating control of elements of Japanese grammar and vocabulary and displaying control of intonation and accent at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student demonstrates strong understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at intermediate level with almost no mistakes.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student demonstrates generally strong and mostly consistent understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with few mistakes.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student demonstrates reasonable understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with somewhat frequent mistakes with somewhat frequent mistakes.

Marginal (D)

The student demonstrates limited understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with frequent mistakes.

Failure (F)

The student demonstrates inadequate understanding of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level with very frequent mistakes.

Assessment Task

2b. Test 2 (Listening Test – 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Demonstrating comprehension of a variety of types of sentences in spoken Japanese for social, commercial and professional purposes at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student demonstrates comprehension of the content of different Japanese dialogues to an excellent standard.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student demonstrates comprehension of the content of different Japanese dialogues to a good standard.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student demonstrates comprehension of the content of different Japanese dialogues to a fair standard.

Marginal (D)

The student demonstrates comprehension of the content of different Japanese dialogues to a barely adequate standard.

Failure (F)

The student demonstrates comprehension of the content of different Japanese dialogues to an inadequate standard.

Assessment Task

2c. Test 2 (Oral Test – 10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Producing a speech with grammatically correct sentences, giving opinions and reasons for actions and plans at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student produces rehearsed speech very fluently at intermediate level, using appropriate expressions with almost no mistakes.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student produces rehearsed speech mostly fluently at intermediate level, using appropriate expressions with few mistakes; mistakes may occasionally impede comprehension.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student produces rehearsed speech comprehensibly at intermediate level, using mostly appropriate expressions with somewhat frequent mistakes; mistakes occasionally impede comprehension.

Marginal (D)

The student produces rehearsed speech somewhat comprehensibly at intermediate level, occasionally using appropriate expressions with frequent mistakes; mistakes often impede comprehension.

Failure (F)

The student produces rehearsed speech which is incomprehensible, with very frequent mistakes.

Assessment Task

3. Weekly Assignments (10% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Demonstrating command of basic elements of Japanese grammar and vocabulary at an intermediate level, roughly equivalent to the JLPT Level N4 (Part 2).

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

The student displays strong command of Japanese written characters, vocabulary and expressions learned in class, with almost no mistakes.

Good (B+, B, B-)

The student displays generally strong command of Japanese written characters, vocabulary and expressions learned in class, with few mistakes.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

The student displays reasonable command of Japanese written characters, vocabulary and expressions learned in class, with somewhat frequent mistakes.

Marginal (D)

The student displays limited command of Japanese written characters, vocabulary and expressions learned in class, with frequent mistakes.

Failure (F)

The student displays very little knowledge of Japanese written characters, basic vocabulary, and expressions, with very frequent mistakes.

Assessment Task

4. In-class Participation (20% of overall course mark)

Criterion

Contributing to class activities, being prepared for lessons, being responsive and attentive throughout classes.

Excellent (A+, A, A-)

Displays strong and consistent effort in class participation.

Good (B+, B, B-)

Displays generally strong and mostly consistent effort in class participation.

Fair (C+, C, C-)

Displays reasonable effort in class participation.

Marginal (D)

Displays marginal effort in class participation.

Failure (F)

Displays very little or no effort in class participation.
